


#### TRAVELING BY CAR



#### **ARRIVAL**

Mini Mak families are welcome to take advantage of our regular "To Camp" ground transportation. Parents may also choose to drop of their mini mak camper if they'd like.

#### **DEPARTURE**

Parents/guardians must pick up their campers from Mini Mak. **Pick up time is between 10am - 11am**. Group tours of camp for parents will be available at 10am.

#### **PACKING FOR CAMP**

Mini Mak Campers follow the regular camp packing list. Laundry will be done once during mini mak and if your camper extends we will continue weekly laundry services.

#### **LUGGAGE ARRANGEMENTS**

Parents should plan to take advantage of Camp Trucking for luggae arrival if utilizing "to camp" ground transportation. Luggage may be dropped off if arriving by car. All luggage may be picked up on departure day or shipped at a later date using Camp Trucking.

### **MORE ON MINI MAK 2023**

#### OTHER IMPORTANT NOTEABLES

- Mini Mak Campers will go on one day trip.
   We recommend \$20 spending money which we will keep in our safe.
- Mini Mak Campers get one phone call home during the middle weekend of their short session at camp. Parents are always welcome to check in with directors anytime and our Mini Mak director will call you with an update within the first 24-48 hours.





#### **TRIPS**

Campers will take up to two trips per session. During the second session, rising 6th grade and up will experience one overnight trip as well. While all trip expenses are included in your required trip fee, your camper may want some additional spending money for treats or souvenirs.

Please keep in mind most places are "cashless" now. Consider sending your child with a Greenlight or pre-loaded credit card. We will collect all cards and keep them in our safe. Cards may be given to a bus or plane counselor or handed to a director at drop off.

Only a certain amount of spending money, designated by camp, will be given out to campers for a trip.

No money/cards may be kept in bunks or with your camper.






# FILLING OUT FORMS THROUGH MYMKN

# **MEDICATIONS DURING THE SUMMER**

Camp Mah-Kee-Nac staffs a full service health center in the summer with four Registered Nurses, two Nursing Students. an Administrative Coordinator and an on-call Physician. Our medical team administers all medication taken by a camper on both a daily and as-needed basis. No medications may be kept in cabins or taken without the knowledge of our medical team

# DAILY AND AS-NEEDED PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS



Mah-Kee-Nac partners with Pack My RX to administer all prescription medications (both daily and as-needed.) The Pack My RX system ensures that each camper receives his correct prescription medication at the correct time. Please closely follow the Pack My RX instructions and letter for your Doctor posted in Forms and Documents.

# OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS

\*\*These are medications like vitamins, Zyrtec, Claritin, or Miralax, etc.

If your camper is on a daily OTC medication, you should plan to send those medications to camp in its original packaging. You may deliver the medication on drop off day to a bus / plane counselor or drop off at camp.

CAMP HAS IN STOCK MOST AS NEEDED OTC MEDICATION A CAMPER WOULD REQUIRE FOR AN ILLNESS OR INJURY. SEE YOUR HEALTH HISTORY FORM FOR A FULL LIST.

#### **ACTIVITY SELECTION**

On June 7 our Activity Selection Form will go live in your MyMKN Account

- At that time campers will be able to select their first week's activities.
- Each week campers will have the opportunity to sit with our directors and program directors to make change to their schedules.
- Athletic leagues: all TJC campers will participate in 2 scheduled athletic leagues per week. LSR and USR campers have the opportunity to elect to participate in an athletic league during the activity selection process or during the first week of camp schedule changes.
- In addition we will offer lot of out-of-camp intercamp games, climbing, hiking, biking and canoeing trips, etc. to opt-in during camp.

### INTENSIVE TENNIS & GOLF

 If your camper is interested in additional, specialized tennis and gold instruction, you may sign up for that using the Additional Options Form in your MyMKN account.







# A FEW IMPORTANT POLICY REMINDERS

#### **NO PACKAGE POLICY**

At Mah-Kee-Nac we place the highest value on relationships and experiences rather than "stuff". Packages will only be accepted for BIRTHDAYS and NECESSITIES. Please contct the office for approval prior to mailing any package. Remind grandparents too!

#### **WE ARE A KIND COMMUNITY**

At MKN everyone is part of the family. The simple rule we follow is that no one is allowed to have fun at someone else's expense. Camp will not tolerate disrespectful or innapropriate behavior between peers or staff. These behaviors are taken seriously and may result in dismissal from camp.

#### **NO ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES**

All campers are under the age of 18. The use or possesion of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, vapes, illegal drugs, alcohol and marijuana will result in immediate dismissal from camp. No refunds.

#### **WE ARE SCREEN FREE**

Take advantage of the time to unplug. We promise you'll still make a good connection. Any device that can access the internet or can be used for electronic communication is strictly prohibited at camp. Items brought to camp will be confiscated and a phone call home will be made.

#### **WE ARE A NUT FREE CAMP**

We have a number of campers and staff at Mah-Kee-Nac who are severely allergic to peanuts and tree-nuts. Therefore we have chosen to be a nut free camp. We do not use or allow into camp any products that use or may contain traces of peanuts or tree-nut.

We ask you to respect this for visiting day and bus snacks as well too.

#### **NO TIPPING POLICY**


As a member of the American Camp Association, we are prohibited from allowing our staff to receive gratuities.

### FIRST WEEK JITTERS



#### DO'S

Set your camper up for success:

**WRITE** your camper a letter prior to his arrival.

**ALLOW** him to be part of the packing process.

**TELL** your camper how much fun he'll have, and that it's okay if he misses home a little.

**TRY** to help him make connections with a few other MKN campers prior to camp.

**GIVE** him all the confidence you have that he is going to have the best summer ever (even if you are crying behind sunglasses).

**TELL** him you love him and you are so proud of him, a lot!



#### **DONT'S**

Here's what to avoid:

**DON'T** make pick up deals (ie. if you don't like it in a week, I'll come pick you up).

**DON'T** talk about what he'll be missing out on at home.

**TRY** not to reveal any big news before camp that could be upsetting to him.

**DON'T** tell him he can call you anytime he needs. We may call you but he will not, unless scheduled.

**DON'T** wait until the last minute to prepare for camp. You'll feel overwhelmed and anxious about the process.



### **REMEMBER**

**IT IS POSSIBLE** for him to miss home and still love camp.

IT IS ORAY for him to be nervous leading up to camp. Make sure he knows this is a normal feeling when trying something new.

**IT IS NORMAL** for parents to be nervous too when sending a child away for the first time.
